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

The 2012 TPS Conference will take place at the Allstream Centre at Exhibition Place (105 Princes' Blvd, Toronto, ON M6K 3C3). Prominently located in front of the Princes' Gates by the Direct Energy Centre, the Allstream Centre is easily accessible by three TTC bus and streetcar lines and by GO train. For families traveling by car, the Allstream Centre is adjacent to the Gardiner Expressway and surrounded by three parking lots

- Driving Directions: From the
 Gardiner Expressway, exit at Lakeshore Blvd. Continue on Lakeshore Blvd. to the Princes' Gates, just west of Strachan Avenue. The Allstream Centre is located next to the Direct Energy Centre on Princes' Blvd.
- Parking: An above-ground parking lot is located directly behind the building off of Princes Blvd, and additional nearby parking lots are located off of Strachan Avenue and Manitoba Drive by the Direct Energy Centre. A day pass for

any of the parking lots at Exhibition Place can be purchased for \$14. Wheelchair-accessible parking spaces are widely available.

Public Transit: By TTC, take the #29D Dufferin bus to Princes' Gate, or either the #511 Bathurst or #509

Harbourfront streetcar to Exhibition Place/Strachan Avenue. By GO train, take the Lakeshore West line to Exhibition Station. Exhibition Station is adjacent to the Horse Palace, a 5-10 minute walk from the Allstream Centre.
